Finally, one of the men could not resist it any longer. He turned to the newcomer and asked, "Where have you been all season." He huffed and said, "My wife bought the season tickets and kept them for a surprise Christmas present!" That's a great idea, but a terrible way to give a gift.

<u>The Greatest Gift Was A Mysterious Gift</u>. Paul spoke to the Corinthians about giving their resources. He pointed out the generosity of the Macedonians and encouraged the Corinthians to be generous as they gave to the special Jerusalem offering. As he concludes his teaching on giving, his thoughts take him to Christ which leads to an outburst of excitement and praise. He said, "Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!" (II Corinthians 9:15). What do you think of when you hear the term "mysterious" gift? I assume that it's something that fills your heart with wonder and awe. That is exactly what the gift of Jesus is to the world.

<u>The Greatest Gift Was A Miraculous Gift</u>. Miracles are often disregarded in our secular culture and the term is often abused when it is used. People can come up with a logical answer for everything, thanks to science and philosophy. However, according to a study by the Pew Forum, 79 percent

of Americans believe in Biblical miracles. There is no miracle greater than the Incarnation! Think of all the miraculous things that happened when Jesus came into the world. The Old Testament prophecies were fulfilled. Things happened exactly as they were foretold (Isaiah 7:14, 9:6, 40:3, Jeremiah 31:15). Angels visited Mary and Joseph on separate occasions. An angelic choir appeared to a group of lowly shepherds. A star unlike any other appeared in the sky and led the Magi to the Christ child. There were visions and dreams. The mother was a virgin. There is no logical human explanation for the miracle of Jesus.

<u>The Greatest Gift Was A Magnificent Gift</u>. This gift is magnificent because it provides peace with God. It promises forgiveness of all your sin. It brings eternal joy. It meets your deepest needs and longings. It sets you free from bondage and slavery. It catapults us into the love of God where we belong. It brings us into the presence of God. It is a gift that keeps giving for all of eternity. Eternal life is for those who do God's will (Matthew 7:21) and it comes from God alone (John 14:6, Titus 1:2, 3:7). There is nothing more magnificent than Jesus.

<u>The Greatest Gift Was A Measureless Gift</u>. There is no gift that compares with the gift of the Christ. The best Christmas gift that you have ever received pales in comparison to the gift God gave that first Christmas to you and me. During the Christmas season stores will run special sales with this little disclaimer, "While supplies last." What they are offering is in limited supply. If you have been seeking the PS5 for a gift this holiday season you already know about this gimmick! By the way, if you do get at limited supply item you might want to keep your receipt and check if they will give a FULL refund. There is no disclaimer, "while supplies last" on the measureless gift of God. All who ask for this gift will receive it and if we are obedient we will be rewarded! God expects us to receive His Son as a gift (John 3:16).

The absolute greatest gift ever given was Jesus Christ! We have no idea when He was born, though Catholics and a handful of Protestants try to push the December 25th date. This is based on the opinion of Hippolytus of Rome in the third century. My opinion is that it was in early to mid September, possibly September 11, according to reliable scholars. Scripture confirms that it was in the Fall or Spring season (Luke 1:24-31, 3:23). It really doesn't matter when He was born, so long as we believe in His birth, death and resurrection. 
